

# MINUTES - REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

A Regular Meeting of Valley Waters Council was held on April 8th, 2025, 7:00 P.M. in Council Chambers of the Municipal Building. Those present were Mayor Randy McKnight, Deputy Mayor Carey Beth Gillis, Councillors Lindsey Ganong, Harold Keith, Mary Francis Keirstead, Charity McDonald, and Stephen Muir. Motion: To approve the meeting agenda.

MOTION CARRIED.

**CONFLICTS OF INTEREST:** Mayor McKnight declared a conflict on item 9I and Deputy Mayor Gillis declared a conflict on item 9H. Both will excuse themselves during those discussions. No other conflicts were declared.

## PRESENTATION:

Stephen Stone, Partner, Dillon Consulting, Planner for Kings RSC. re: process for development of Rural Plan — which is a legal requirement under the Community Planning Act. It establishes clear procedures for development. Mr. Stone explained the process, which is likely to take two years, and will involve three phases:

- 1-2025: background report, setting priorities
- 2- 2026: several community meetings, drafting the community plan, zoning rules
- 3- 2027: presentation of draft to the public and Council, final adoption

Council discussed the need to balance personal freedom and rural lifestyle with managing natural resources /environmental concerns and avoiding conflict. Responsible growth and housing requires a careful approach, including considerations for affordability. Council will have opportunities to provide input at every step. Councillor Keith reflected on his previous experience with this and the necessity for having a Rural Plan.

### **CAO's REPORT:**

The CAO was asked about the Community Awards and responded that the only category that hasn't received a nomination is Youth Leadership. Councillor McDonald asked about the Designated Materials list for farm plastics. The CAO stated that there is a lengthy list, but this option seems like the most straightforward way to have Circular Materials pick it up. A question was asked about insurance coverage for the Belleisle Canada Day event. The Valley Waters insurance broker does not recommend that we cover the event, as we are not the organizers. Councillor Keirstead pointed out that the e-newsletter is not mobile friendly. The CAO will have that remedied.

#### **NEW BUSINESS AND CONSIDERATIONS OF MOTIONS:**

A. **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Clerk-Treasurer and Mayor be authorized to issue and sell to the New Brunswick Municipal Finance Corporation, a Municipality of Valley Waters debenture in the principle amount of \$830,000 on such terms and conditions as are recommended by the New Brunswick Municipal Finance Corporation, and **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Municipality of Valley Waters agrees to issue post-dated cheques payable to the New Brunswick Municipal Finance Corporation as and when they are requested in payment of principle and interest charges on the above debenture.
